Day of Remembrance – Friday August 26 2022

When a loved one passes away, it is undeniable that we experience a range of emotions under grief. It has been especially hard and complex to grieve and honour deaths in the era of Covid as we used to. Funerals were restricted, small gatherings only, hospital restrictions.....and this has interrupted the normal grieving process. We became detached from death. We didn't grieve properly. Or we held on longer because we were in denial. Whilst we know that death happens, it does not remove the emotion and we all require comfort and closure in some form.

We find comfort in our faith, being you Muslim, Christian, Jew or Hindu. Each faith gives us words of comfort, in the written and spoken teachings, that help us overcome the loss and despair we feel. We feel comfort that our loved one is with God.

We find comfort from our friends who gather around us and fill the void left. Really good friends will be there for a long time afterwards.

We find comfort in the photographs and memories of our family members and friends who have passed on. Last year for Christmas I gave each member of my family a book of photos of the family as a permanent record of the people in our family. I also included the families of my two son's wives. Whilst I was preparing the book and going through all the photos, I cried my eyes out as the memories came flooding back to me. But completing the book gave me comfort knowing that, one day even my little granddaughter, Izzy....will know who my mom and dad were and what her other granny looks like.

We as a School understand that this is a difficult time for you, and should you feel you or a loved one need support or guidance, please reach out or encourage a loved one to seek help and guidance.

Almost all faiths remind us that death is indeed not the end, but the beginning of our next chapter, of our inevitable return to our creator an eternal existence in the hereafter. Let us take the death of a loved one, or of someone close or distant passing away as an opportunity to be more present in the lives of the people close to us. I remember sitting in church as a younger man listening to an older man speaking to the men of the parish. His wife had been diagnosed with motor neuron disease. She was dying. His talk was entitled "Give her the roses now"....in other words don't wait for a special occasion to do something nice, don't wait till you're at a funeral to say nice words. It's too late then.

The last three years have been a period of tremendous trials and tribulations. Many of us have lost loved ones to COVID-19. Each one of us needs HOPE. We need to have something to hold on to. This is why we need one another, especially in families.

My prayer for you today is that you re-connect with your loved ones. That you mend broken friendships. My prayer is that you "Give her the roses now". My Prayer is that if you are Muslim, that the dua's you have made for loved ones who have passed, are heard. My prayer is that if you are Christian, that the prayers of supplication you have prayed too come to fulfilment.

Instead of a prayer, I will finish with this short poem, entitled "we remember them".






