e are about to welcome the Grade 10's AND 11'S BACK TO SCHOOL. Over the past month the staff, the parents and the matric learners have been finding their way throughout "New Normal". It has worked surprisingly well despite the strangeness of it all at first. We have spent the past month refining our systems as it became obvious for us to do so. These were mostly practical matters and didn't really affect the learners in any significant way.

The imminent entry of the Grade 10s and 11s has brought us some timetabling issues but Mr Cohen and Mr Goliath have wrestled long and hard to come up with the perfect timetable. The Grade 12's will receive their full notional time and the other grades will receive 50% of their notional time at school. We are restricted to 50% or less of the learners on campus on any given day.

It is pleasing to note that our 5 Golden Rules are being observed religiously and as a result we have minimised the risk of contracting Covid 19 on campus. I am pleased to report that we have no active cases of Covid-19 amongst staff or the grade 12 learners who have been on campus this past month.

One of the areas we are struggling with is how to keep the learners occupied during break times. They can't play ball games. They're not allowed to play cards or dominoes. They are not allowed do socialise in large groups and doing nothing, other than standing around and chatting, for 40 minutes at a time, is pretty boring after a while. If anyone has any creative suggestions as to what the learners can do at break time, without increasing the risks, I'd be happy to hear them.

I do encourage the parents of the 10s and 11s to send their children to school next week for the orientation sessions and then from the 6 July onwards. I really believe the children need to come back to school for the structure and camaraderie it provides. As long as they follow the Covid-19 protocols at school, the risk is minimised.
