The RCL is a statutory body comprising of 3 learners per grade, who are elected by their peers. The RCL leadership team are referred to as the Co-Chairs of the RCL, whilst the leadership team of the Prefects are called the Head Prefects. Together the 6 learners make up the Heads of School, who all meet regularly with the Principal.

At the recent Award Ceremony both sets of leadership bodies were invested and the various leaders announced. As RCL Chairs, we have Kaydin Adams, Grade 10, and Brayden Brown, Grade 11, and as Head Prefects, we have Dorian Maralack and Zoë Engledoe, with Deputy Head Prefects being Mughammad Van Der Schyff and Zoë Mostert. Six very capable young people who have the School's interests at heart and who, I am sure, will all give a good account of themselves over the next year. 






PREFECT CAMP

Lara Borman in Grade 9 participated in the **Take to the Stage Dance Festival** at Zwaanswyk Academy last weekend and achieved great results.


The categories she participated in and results were as follows:

Once again our hearts burst with pride and can't wait to see what Lara's going to achieve next! Photo & report submitted by Nikki Borman



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




















2023 VISUAL ART EXHIBITION

Mia Goliath in grade 8, participated in the Sanlam 10km and the Ysterplaat 10km over the past 2 weekends. Well done Mia ♣.*








