et me take you on a journey a few years back in time....and then a peek into the future. The present reflects the realisation of dreams and visions of the past and so it is good to have a look into the future every now and then and dream. But first, a quick look back.

About 6 or 7 years ago now we were the first school in the country to invest in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century class-room by incorporating Interactive Whiteboards, data projectors and computers, along with high speed internet into the classrooms. We embarked on a plan to upgrade the teachers' workstations in every classroom. This, along with the additional teachers the parents pay for, was a massive injection into the Academic pillar of the school.

The Sporting pillar also received a massive investment over the past 4 or 5 years with the construction of the Pavilion, the front stands, the floodlights and the world class Astro facility. Last year the SGB approved a series of developments aimed at improving the Administration pillar of the school. This is currently in progress but it included the investment in a stable school

Management Database, the rationalisation of office space and upgrading of office furniture, similar to the teachers' work-stations indicated above. These developments are in line with the SGB's policy of attracting and retaining quality staff. We have created an intern office out of an old storeroom and the IT administrators and the Continuing Education programme also have new offices. By the end of the year (hopefully sooner) we will have a renovated Front Office/Foyer and Finance Department. The SGB also approved the upgrading of the Gym Hall access on the North side, with disabled access, a new roof and doors. Phase 1 is almost complete.

Our Academic needs for the future include the following: removing the prefabs and constructing 5 new classrooms, the consolidation of our music department into a custom designed music centre and moving our counsellors into the present Music corridor. This process should take another 2 years, as we engage the WCED on the construction of the additional classrooms – a time consuming process. The proposed extensions would be towards the back of the school, at the current Technology block. A wireless network, along with some sort of device in the hands of the pupils, is also part of this dream. The Sporting needs for the future are about 5 - 6 years away with the dream of constructing a multi-purpose indoor sports facility, inclusive of a water polo pool, a variety of indoor sports, squash and gym at the southern end of the Astro. The gym being an income generating feature.

All these things have been on the Dream Plan for years and slowly but surely we are ticking off the boxes as we grow and develop. Each SGB over the years has had the foresight to plan ahead for the big dream and sooner or later the dreams will becoming reality. Hence my reason for looking back a few years and then looking forward.

Whether the developments will actually happen is not of any consequence right now. What is of consequence is that the school community knows what our hopes and dreams are. In this way the Parents' Association has a focus. The past pupils will also have a role to play. The local community is briefed on our aspirations. The present staff and pupils know that the way ahead is constantly being mapped out. Academic, sporting, cultural and administrative growth, along with development of the facility, will continue to keep Bergvliet High offering a world class education. STEPHEN PRICE


